This glossary provides simple descriptions of improvement measures outlined within the consultation drawings.

Term	Description	Image
One-way street	Vehicles are only permitted to travel in one direction along a street.	Image capture: July 2024 © 2025 Google
Contraflow Cycling	Cyclists are allowed to travel in the opposite direction to one-way vehicle traffic. Sometimes this is permitted without dedicated markings or signage.	Image capture: August 2024 © 2025 Google



Term	Description	Image
Formalise On-Street Parking/ Marked Out Bays	Converting informal or unrestricted parking into designated and marked parking bays, usually with road markings and signs.	Image capture: August 2017 © 2025 Google
Residents' Parking Scheme	A scheme that prioritises parking spaces for local residents, usually requiring a permit.	Resident permit holders only Source: Pell Frischmann
Raised Zebra Crossing	A zebra crossing that is built on a raised platform to slow down traffic and improve safety for pedestrians.	Fource: Pell Frischmann

Widened Footways	Pavements that have been made wider to provide more space for pedestrians.	Fource: Pell Frischmann
Continuous Footways	Pavements that continue across side roads at the same height and surface, giving priority to pedestrians over turning vehicles.	Image capture: May 2023 © 2025 Google
Junction Resurfacing	Repaving or improving the surface of a road junction to ensure it is in good condition.

Tightening the Mouth of the Junction	Reducing the width of a junction's entry or exit to slow down turning vehicles and shorten pedestrian crossing distances.	Image capture: November 2020 © 2025 Google
Conversion of a mini- roundabout to a T- Junction	Altering a mini-roundabout into a simple T- shaped layout to streamline traffic movements and enhance safety.	Fource: Pell Frischmann
Pedestrian and Cycle Zone	A street or area where motor vehicle access is limited or restricted, giving priority to pedestrians and cyclists.	PEDESTRIAN and CYCLE ZONE O No vehicles Except for access Source: Pell Frischmann
